

Timeline of the Hartselle Camp Meeting

Winter of 1900 – According to the camp history written by Mrs. Guin Puckett: “Ben Huckabee, Mr. & Mrs. Banks Bradley, Buck Sheats, Frank Orr and Byrd White met to discuss building a tabernacle. With snow on the ground, they walked south along the railroad tracks to the spot where the tabernacle would be built. The presence of the spring at the base of the hill was a big factor in the site selection.” Mr. Bradley bought the land and later sold it to the Camp Association.

Feb. 3, 1900 – The New Decatur Advertiser says Rev. B.W. Huckabee is preparing to erect a tabernacle on a plot of land about one mile south of town. About 10 acres of land has been purchased for the site. Lumber is being placed on the grounds and building will begin immediately.

Friday, June 29, 1900 – The New Decatur Advertiser states that the building being erected south of town will soon be completed. Rev. B.W. Huckabee will begin a camp meeting there June 26th to continue ten days. Apparently the meeting was moved back to August 2.

1900 – 1st Camp Meeting-August 2-12 from newspaper accounts -Dr. John L. Brasher of Attalla and Rev. A.J. Quattlebaum of GA evangelists. Andrew Jones of Falkville-music. Banks Bradley-Camp President.

August 13, 1900 – Huckabee & A. J. Quattlebaum leave for Waco, Texas to conduct a meeting.

Christmas, 1900 – Huckabee preached his farewell sermon at the Methodist Church in Hartselle. He and his family are moving to Texas.

1901 – 2nd Camp Meeting-August 1-11 -Dr. John L. Brasher and H. G. Scuddy (Scudday) of Cincinnati evangelists. Wallace Murphree-music. The Nashville American on July 30,1901 stated Brasher and H. G. Scuddy of Cincinnati would hold the ten-day meeting. The Alabama Enquirer (Hartselle) on August 1 said Brasher and Scuddy were the evangelists. A “History of Hartselle Camp Meeting’ by Mrs. Guin Puckett, Camp Historian, says Brasher and A. J. Quattlebaum were the evangelists. This was from talking with Brasher. Could Brashers’s memory be wrong or did Scuddy have to cancel at the last minute and Quattlebaum filled in? The New Decatur Advertiser on Fri. August 9, 1901 stated on August 27th that trains Nos. 1 and 4 of the L&N Railroad will stop at Hartselle Sunday for the camp meeting.

1902 – 3rd Camp Meeting-August 21-31-Rev. Ben Huckabee and Dr. J.L. Brasher-evangelists. Andrew Jones-music. The New Decatur Advertiser says Brasher and Rev. Ben Huckabee were the evangelists while a camp history by David Cummings says Edd Ferguson was with Brasher. The Advertiser article says the train will stop at the camp and there will be a sleeping room. Bring your bedding. A restaurant will furnish meals.

1903 – 4th Camp Meeting-July 30-August 8-Rev. H.G. Scuddy (Scudday), Dr. John L. Brasher and Rev. Bud “Uncle Buddy” Robinson-evangelists

1904 – 5th Camp Meeting-August 19-Sept.4-Revs. J.L. Brasher and E.A. Ferguson-evangelists.

1905 – 6th Camp Meeting-August 30-Sept. 10-Rev. H.C. Morrison and J. L. Brasher evangelists.

1906 – 7th Camp Meeting-August 16-26-Rev. H.C. Morrison-evangelist.

1907 – 8th Camp Meeting- August 16-26- Rev. J.L. Brasher and Sister L.O. Stratton-evangelists. . Research on Mrs. Stratton showed she had given a devotion at a national holiness conference and was active in the Women’s Christian Temperance Organization.

1908 – 9th Camp Meeting-Revs. Brasher and Joseph Owen-evangelists.

1909 – 10th Camp Meeting-August 20-30-Nashville Banner says a number of visiting preachers were the evangelists including John L. Brasher of Boaz and Rev. Richard Robinson of Penial, TX. I believe Rev. Richard Robinson is actually Rev. Reuben “Uncle Buddy” Robinson from Peniel, Texas. No Rev. Richard Robinson from Texas was found.

1910 – 11th Camp Meeting-July 28-Aug.8-Revs. J.L. Brasher and Joseph Owen-evangelists. Banks Bradley-Camp President.th

1911 – 12th Camp Meeting-August 4-14-T.F. Maitland and Hamp Sewell-evangelists.

1912 – 13th Camp Meeting-August 2-12-Revs. John F. Owen and W.D. Swope evangelists. (No W. D. Swope was found. Should be W. C. Swope) Andrew Jones-music. “There will be a good shelter for all those who come from a distance and a good restaurant on the grounds.” S. B. Bradley of Hartselle.

1913 – 14th Camp Meeting-August 8-17-The Birmingham Age Herald states Rev. John F. Owens of Boaz is in charge, assisted by Mrs. L.O. Stratton of Lebanon, TN. The Rev. L. L. Pickett is in charge of the song services and also preaches. .

1914 – 15th Camp Meeting-July 31-August 9-Rev. W.L. Clark and Prof. E.T. Franklin of Wilmore, KY evangelists. Rev. Paul Brasher-song leader.

1915 – 16th Camp Meeting-July31 -Aug. 9-Rev. E.T. Franklin and Rev. J. L. Mitchell evangelists.

1916 – 17th Camp Meeting-August 11-21-John F. Owen, J.L. Mitchell and T.S. Blanton evangelists. Believe this should be G. T. Blanton from Florence, AL who did several revivals with Mitchell. No T. S. Blanton was found.

1917 – 18th Camp Meeting-July 27-Aug. 5-Revs. John and Joseph Owens-evangelists.

1918 – 19th Camp Meeting-August 1-11-Revs. O. H. Callis and J. B. Kendall -Rev Harry Blackburn stated he began leading the music in 1918.

1919 – 20th Camp Meeting-Revs. O.H. Callis and J. B. Kendall evangelists. Rev. H.W. Blackburn-music.

1920 – 19th Camp Meeting- August 5-15-Revs. J.B. Kendall and O.H. Callis evangelists. H.W. Blackburn preached and sang.

1921 – 22nd Camp Meeting-August 4-14-Revs. J. B. Kendall and J.R. Carville-The Pentecostal Herald has a note from camp president L. O. Waldsmith that “Jimmy B. Kendall peached such sermons as never before and Brothers Carville and Jones were mighty in song and preaching.” Believe Waldsmith was the camp secretary. Jones would be A.J. Jones from Falkville.

1922 – 23rd Camp Meeting-July 26th - Rev. J.W. Carter of Harriman, TN, and Rev. Andrew Johnson of Wilmore, KY evangelists. Professor C.P. Gossett of Wilmore-music. Albany-Decatur Daily states large crowds

1923 – 24th Camp Meeting-August 2- 12-Revs. J.E. Hewson and J. L. Brasher evangelists. L.O. Waldsmith-camp president??.

1924 – 25th Camp Meeting-August 14-24-Revs. J.E. Hewson and V.A. Wood. Mr. and Mrs. Pollock music. L. O. Waldsmith was listed as camp secretary.

1925 – 26th Camp Meeting-August 6-16-O.H. Callis and Jordan D. Carter evangelists. Harry Blackburn-music. Waldsmith is again listed as camp president.

1926 – 27th Camp Meeting-August 19-29-O.H. Callis and J.D. Carter evangelists-Harry Blackburn-music.

1927 – 28th Camp Meeting-August 4-14-O.H. Callis and Joseph Owen-evangelists. Rev. Harry Blackburn-music

1928 – 29th Camp Meeting-July 28-Aug. 7-Rev. O.H. Callis and Joseph and Wiley Owen evangelists.

1929 – 30th Camp Meeting-August 15-25-Revs. J.B. Kendall and Joseph Owen evangelists. Rev. Harry Blackburn song leader.

1930 – 31st Camp Meeting-August 21-31-Rev. J.L. Brasher and Rev. Jordan Carter-evangelists. Harry Blackburn-singer. “Homecoming Event”

1931 – 32nd Camp Meeting-August 13-23-Rev. John Owen of Columbus, Ohio and Rev. O.H. Callis of Willmore, KY evangelists.

1932 – 33rd Camp Meeting-August 18-28- Dr. C.E. Hardy, President of Trevecca College, Nashville and Dr. Joseph Owen, President of John Fletcher College, Oskaloosa, Iowa evangelists. The concrete wall around the spring was built that year.

1933 – 34th Camp Meeting, August 17-28-Only one evangelist due to financial problems (Great Depression). Rev. J. A. Manasco, Supt. Of the Alabama District of the Nazarene Church from Nauvoo, AL. evangelist. Rev. Elton Jones says he preached his first sermon at this camp meeting. Mr. Carmon Sloan of Louisville, KY music and D.W. Puckett was Camp President.

1934 – 35th Camp Meeting, Aug. 23-Sept. 2- Rev. John Owen and Rev. J. A. Manasco evangelists.

1935 – 36th Camp Meeting, August 22-Sept. 1-Dr. H.C. Morrison of Wilmore, KY and Dr. John L. Brasher of Boaz, AL evangelists. James Brasher, son of Dr. Brasher, led the music.

1936 – 37th Camp Meeting, August 20-30- Dr. Joseph Owen and Rev. J.H. Chitwood evangelists.

NOTE: On August 7, 1936, The Decatur Daily had a paragraph stating that to co-operate with the health department in the fight against infantile paralysis (polio) that D.W. Puckett, President of the Hartselle Camp Meeting, announced that the annual camp meeting would not be held. On August 13, 1936, the Hartselle Enquirer carried an announcement that camp would be held and the date moved back to August 20-30.

1937 – 38th Camp Meeting, August 5-15- Rev. James Burton Kendall of Lexington, KY and Dr. O.H. Callis of Willmore, KY evangelists. Rev. Steve Kimbrough of Elkmont led the music.

1938 – 39th Camp Meeting-July 21-31-Rev. O.H. Callis and Rev. J.B. Kendall evangelists. Brother and Mrs. Lewis of Kentucky-music. Tabernacle re-roofed.

1939 – 40th Camp Meeting, August 1-10-O. H. Callis- evangelist. Rev. and Mrs. M.L. Lewis of Wilmore, KY music and youth. Ben Drake was Camp President.

1940 – 41st Camp Meeting, July 31-August 10, Dr. Horace Sprague and C.M. Dunaway- evangelists.

1941 – 42nd Camp Meeting, July 31-August 10-Dr. H.A. Sprague of Lexington, KY evangelist and Rev. and Mrs. Longino of the Salvation Army of Decatur music and youth.

1942 – 43rd Camp Meeting, July 30-August 9-Rev. James P. Brasher, son of J.L. Brasher and Dr. Horace Sprague evangelists. Mrs. Frank Longino-youth. Dr. Lambuth Archibald, Decatur will preach July 31.

1943 – 44th Camp Meeting, July 29-August 7-Dr. H.A. Sprague, Rev. Mack Hamby of Florence evangelists. Water had been installed.

1944 – 45th Camp Meeting, August 3-13-Dr. H.A. Sprague, Dr. Phillips Brooks Smith of FMC Hammond, IN evangelists. Youth- Mrs. M.P. Vickery and Mrs. Falla Bailey of Decatur, AL.

1945 – 46th Camp Meeting- August 2-13-Rev. E.A. Lacour from University Park, Iowa, and Dr. Harry Denman-evangelists. Mrs. Lacour-music and youth. Rev. John Klinepeter-music and soloist, August 5-15.

1946 – 47th Camp Meeting-August 1-11-Dr. John L. Brasher and Dr. E.R. Overley-Kentucky Methodist Conference-evangelists. J. Byron Crouse assisted by Mrs. Crouse at the piano music and youth. Meals for 10 days \$10. if you wanted to camp, contact Paul Eubanks at the Motor Supply Co. in Decatur. Friends of the camp with odd dishes, especially plates and cups, were asked to bring them to the Motor Supply Co. or the home of Mrs. J.L. Praytor of Decatur. Also, a request for fresh vegetables was made.

1947 – 48th Camp Meeting-July 31-August 10-Dr. Joseph Owen of Atlanta, GA and Rev. O.H. Callis of West Palm Beach, FL are the evangelists. Rev. and Mrs. Kleinpeter music and youth. Mrs. J.L. Praytor-dining hall. A motion to restrict the use of the camp grounds to church meetings went into effect. This was to return the camp to original charter which said the sole purpose of the camp was for religious meetings. New dining hall in use.

1948 – 49th Camp Meeting-July 29-August 8-Rev. B.G. Carnes of Wilmore, KY evangelist. Rev. John Kleinpeter of Savannah, GA youth(some preaching) and Paul Howe Eubanks and Dean Jones, Decatur, song leaders

NOTE: On the camp brochures, 1949 is called the 49th Camp Meeting. The 1950 brochure has the 50th Camp Meeting. I feel like this was just a mistake. In 1952, the numbering goes back to adding one year to the date and calls it the 53rd Camp Meeting.

1949 – 50th Camp Meeting-July 28-August 7-Dr. E.R. Overly, general evangelist for the Kentucky Conference of the Methodist Church, Rev. John Kleinpeter of Savannah, GA youth and some preaching. Rev. and Mrs. Clay Milby of Valdosta, GA song leaders.

1950 – 51st Camp Meeting- June 29-July 9-The 50th anniversary of the camp was celebrated. Not sure why and also not sure why camp was moved up on the calendar. Dr. John L. Brasher of Attala, AL and Dr. Horace Sprague of IN evangelists. Rev. and Mrs. Clay Milby of Valdosta, GA music. A. Guy Jones-Camp President.

1951 – 52nd Camp Meeting-July 12-22-Dr. O.H. Callis of West Palm Beach, FL and Rev. J. B. Kendall of Lexington, KY evangelists. Rev. and Mrs. Clay Milby of Valdosta, GA music.

1952 – 53rd Camp Meeting-July 3-13-Rev. Forest E. Church of Avon Park, FL and Rev. Clarence Whalen evangelists. Mrs. Whalen was pianist. Rev. Horace Sprague of Evansville, IN was to be an evangelist but was unable to attend. He was also camp president.

1953 – 54th Camp Meeting-July 2-12-Dr. B.C. Gamble of Atlanta and Dr. J. R. Parker of Wilmore, KY evangelists. Curtis R. Brown of Canton, OH music.

1954 – 55th Camp Meeting-July 1-11-Dr. S.H. Tuberville of Winter Park, FL and Dr. James D. Gibson of Wilmore, KY evangelists. Curtis R. Brown music and wife on vibraharp.

1955 – 56th Camp Meeting-June 30-July 10-Rev. L.S. Hoover of Tionesta, PN and Rev. Paul Finch of Xenia, OH evangelists. Music by “The Singing Shepherds” Charles and Jeanette Shepherd. Carolyn Teague, Camp President.

1956 – 57th Camp Meeting-August 2-12-Dr. Horace Sprague and Rev. Sullens Dosser evangelists. Music led by The Cummins Family.

1957 – 58th Camp Meeting-August 1-11-Dr. O.H. Callis of West Palm Beach, FL and Dr. G. Nelson Moore of Misenheimer, NC evangelists. Rev. V.S. Rushing of Montgomery music. Rev. M.J. Murphree of Oneonta is Camp President. He was a missionary to Africa for 37 years.

1958 – 59th Camp Meeting-July 31-August 10-Rev. Elton Jones of Knoxville, TN and Rev. Jack Wease of Sweetwater, TX evangelists. Rev. and Mrs. Earl Bryant of Wilmore, KY music and Rev. Bryant also preached.

1959 – 60th Camp Meeting-July 30-August 9- Rev. H.W. Blackburn of Parkersburg, WV and Rev. Elton Jones of Knoxville evangelists. Robert Blackburn music. Myra Martin-missionary

1960 – 61st Camp Meeting-August 4-14-Rev. Joseph Lewis of Wilmore, KY and Rev. Jack Pierce of Elkhart, IN evangelists. Rev. Walter Brannon of Logansport, IN music.

1961 – 62nd Camp Meeting-August 3-13-Rev. E.R. Overly of Avon Park, FL and Rev. G.M. Rainey of Hapeville, GA evangelists. Robert Blackburn-music and youth. Camp nurse Miss Alice Pettit who has been a missionary to Africa. Mr. Sherman Powell of Falkville-Camp President.

1962 – 63rd Camp Meeting-August 2-12-Rev. Elton Jones and Dr. Harry Blackburn evangelists. Bob Blackburn-music and youth. Miss Caroline Heater- camp missionary.

1963 – 64th Camp Meeting-August 1-11-Rev. Jon Tal Murphree of Wedowee, AL, Rev. Elton Jones and Rev. E.R. Overly of Avon Park, FL evangelists. Rev. Richard Beals-music. Carolyn Teague-missionary.

1964 – 65th Camp Meeting-July 30-August 9-Rev. Elton Jones and Dr. Delbert Rose of Wilmore, KY evangelists. Rev. Richard Beals-music and Myra Martin missionary.

1965 – 66th Camp Meeting-July 29-August 8-Rev. Jon Tal Murphree and Lon Woodrum from the Oklahoma-Texas Conference evangelists. Rev. Richard Beals music. The ad in the Decatur Daily says 65th camp meeting instead of 66th.

1966 – 67th Camp Meeting- August 4-14. Dr Elton Jones, pastor of the Red Bay Methodist Church, Chattanooga, TN and Rev. Paul Eubanks, Jr., pastor of Forest Heights Methodist Church, Jackson, TN are evangelists. Rev. Richard Beals music. Miss Carolyn Teague will be in charge of the Camp Mission Day, Wednesday, August 10th at 2:00. The speakers will be from Kenya, Malaysia and Japan.

1967 – 68th Camp Meeting-August 3-13. Dr. Harry Blackburn and Rev. Garland Lewis evangelists. The Singing Shepherds (Mr. and Mrs. Charles Shepherd) music. Miss Carolyn Teague in charge of Camp Missionary Day, Thursday afternoon, August 10

1968 – 69th Camp Meeting-August 1-11. Rev. Richard Beals and Rev. William R. Rudd are the evangelists. Rev. James Brasher will be the song evangelist. Carolyn Teague in charge of Missions Day and Miss Viola Mae Doyle is the guest missionary. Sunday afternoon 100-year-old Rev. J. L. Brasher will speak.

1969 – 70th Camp Meeting-July 31-August 10-Dr. Harry Blackburn and Dr. H.M. Couchenour from Willmore, Ky evangelists. Rev. Richard Beals-music. “Dr. John Brasher, 101 years old, will speak Sunday afternoon at the Hartselle Tabernacle at 2:30. Dr. Brasher is a remarkable man and the oldest Methodist minister in the North Alabama Conference. Dr. Brasher preached the memorial service at the Annual Conference at Birmingham Southern in June.” Mrs. Virginia Law will be the guest missionary. She and her husband served in the Congo for 15 years where her husband, Burleigh Law, was martyred by the Congolese rebels in 1964.

1970 – 71st Camp Meeting-July 30-August 9-Lon Woodrum and Jon Tal Murphree evangelists. Rev. James H. Brasher music. Garnett Townsend-missionary

1971 – 72nd Camp Meeting- July 29-August 8-Dr.Harry Blackburn and his son Rev. Robert F. Blackburn of West Palm Beach, F evangelists. Dr. Blackburn wanted his whole family involved so his other son, David Blackburn and his wife Gail are the musicians. Dr. Blackburn’s daughter, Mrs. Jane Blackburn MacFarland will help with singing and youth.

1972 – 73rd Camp Meeting-August 3-13th. Evangelists Elton Jones & W.J. Alston of Birmingham.

1973 – 74th Camp Meeting- August 2-August, 12. Returning evangelists are the father-son team of Rev. Harry W. Blackburn and Rev Robert F. Blackburn. Song leader will be another member of this family, David Blackburn. Jewel Whybrew-youth and missionary. Edith Gallagher-youth and children.

1974 – 75th Camp Meeting-August 1-11. Rev. Elton Jones and Tillford Junkins evangelists. Bob MacFarland-music

1975 – 76th Camp Meeting-July 31-August 10- Dr. Harry Blackburn and his son, Rev. Robert Blackburn are the evangelists. Bob and Margaret MacFarland-youth

1976 – 77th Camp Meeting-July 29-August 8- Rev. Elton Jones, Rev. G. Stuart McWhirter and Rev. Bill Alston are the evangelists. David Blackburn is the music evangelist. Bob and Margaret MacFarland are the youth leaders and Rev. James Hord the guest missionary. Sherman Powell President.

1977 – 78th Camp Meeting-August 4-14. The Blackburn's return as evangelists- Dr. Harry Blackburn and Rev. Robert F. Blackburn. Rev. David Blackburn-music. Dr. Blackburn's daughter Jane MacFarland-pianist.

1978 – 79th Camp Meeting-August 3-13-Elton Jones, Dr. Mack Anderson of Decatur, GA and Rev. Gary Case of Louisville, Ky are evangelists. David and Karen Gagnor-music. Ken and Judy Steele-youth

1979 – 80th Camp Meeting-August 2-12--Jon Tal Murphree one evangelist. Paul Qualls-music. David and Marguerite Anderson-brother and sister-youth.

1980 – 81st Camp Meeting-July 31-August 10- Mack Anderson of Decatur, GA, Bill Alston of Oneonta, AL and Roy T. McKinney of Orlando, FL evangelists. Tommy Duckworth music. Harry Puckett-Camp President for first year.

1981 – 82nd Camp Meeting-July 30-August 9-Elton Jones, Tilford L. Junkins and Rev. David Watson evangelists. Paul M. Qualls-music, Steve and Sue Carl-youth. Timothy and Janice Brunk missionaries. Harry Puckett President.

1982 – 83rd Camp Meeting-July 29-August 8-Rev. Richard Brunk of Jackson, MS and Rev. R. N. Raycroft of Howell, MI evangelists.

1983 – 84th Camp Meeting- Rev. Gary Case of Louisville, KY and Rev. Roy T. McKinney of Orlando, FL evangelists, Paul M. Qualls music, Youth- David Cummings, Ron Puckett and Leree McCaig. Dr. and Mrs. Ted Batson - guest missionaries.

1984 – 85th Camp Meeting- August 2-12- Elton Jones and Clark Pope evangelists. Tilford Junkins was supposed to be an evangelist but had phlebitis. Clark Pope substituted. Camp President Harry Puckett in hospital with a ruptured disc. Howard and Peggy Kraft music. Rob and Darlene Lamb youth. Dr. and Mrs. Ted Batson guest missionaries.

1985 – 86th Camp Meeting-August 1-11-Lon Woodrum, Ben Marlin evangelists-Buzz Cummings - Bible teacher, Howard and Peggy Kraft-music, Rob and Darlene Lamb-youth- Paul and Patsy Shigledecker-missionaries

1986 – 87th Camp Meeting-August 3-10-Tilford Junkins and Clark Pope-evangelists. Ray Carby-music. Darlene Lamb, Rob Cain, Ron Puckett and Susie Burgess-youth directors. Dining Hall-Margaret Puckett and Mary Tarlton

1987 – 88th Camp Meeting-July 30-August 9-Elton Jones, Jon Tal Murphree evangelists. Howard and Peggy Craft music. Doug and Stephanie Lang youth directors. Mark and Serena Dunbar missionaries.

1988 – 89th Camp Meeting-August 4-14-Gary Case and Keith Pope evangelists. Ray Carby of Utica, Ky is music evangelist. Robert & Elizabeth Welsh of Ridgeville, IN-youth & children.

1989 – 90th Camp Meeting-August 3-13- Elton Jones (at this point has been evangelist for more than a dozen times), Eldon Fuhrman evangelists- Shingledecker missions. Paul Qualls-music and Bob and Elizabeth Welsh youth. Children in the third grade and above can camp full time and younger children are welcome as day campers or if their parents are staying on the grounds. Children camp for \$40 plus a \$15 activity fee and Youth (13 and above) camp for \$60 plus a \$15 activity fee. Day campers fee is \$30 (includes lunch and activity fee).

1990 – 91st Camp Meeting-August 2-12-The Popes-Clark, Mike and Keith-evangelists. Howard and Peggy Kraft-music. Rev. and Mrs. Charles Winters-missionaries.

1991 – 92nd Camp Meeting-August 1-11-Gary Case and George Creel evangelists. Maynard Walker- music. Chris and Mary Lohrstorfer- youth. Mark and Serena Dunbar- missionaries.

1992 – 93rd Camp Meeting-July 30-August 9-Elton Jones, Clark Pope (replaced Rev. Tilford Junkins) and David Watson-evangelists. Richard Bolin-music and Grad Tanner- youth. Betty Burbank- guest missionary.

1993 – 94th Camp Meeting-July 29-August 8-Alton Parris from Gadsden, Al and Gary Case from Louisville, KY evangelists-Howard and Peggy Craft-music. Grad Tanner-youth. David and Rachel Kerney-missionaries.
